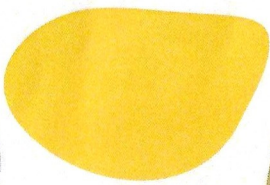
Preferred options consultation

Changes in government housing targets mean around 18,650 new homes are now needed in the Cotswold District by 2043. Meeting this target will likely involve developing large sites or new settlements, some of which may continue delivering housing beyond 2043.

The council has set out initial options and the council's preferred option on where these homes and supporting infrastructure could go - and we want to hear your views on those proposals.
